SPECIAL EVENT -- DETROIT INSTITUTE OF ARTS -- ART IN FRANCE, 1852-1870

Detroit and Philadelphia are the only North American cities to see the largest exhibition ever to visit here, and the Senior Men's Club has arranged a special lunch and tour for members (and spouses) Tuesday, February 13th. Price of tour, including lunch, is \$6.75 per person. Transportation is not included. Members are asked to drive or to share the ride.

Plan to arrive at the Institute of Arts in ample time for the lunch, which is scheduled for 11:30 a.m. in the North Court. Park either under the Art Institute (off Farnsworth Street) or under the Rackham building (entrance off Warren). There are also surface parking lots on John R. If taking the John Lodge freeway, exit at Forest -- the first exit after the Edsel Ford interchange. Go left on Forest, and left on Woodward to Farnsworth -- or to Warren if parking under Rackham building. If taking Woodward all the way, Farnsworth is the street on the south side of the Art Institute.

There are 362 paintings, sculptures, furnishings and other objects in this exhibition -- a glowing reflection of life during the brief but glittering reign of Napoleon III and Empress Eugenie.

After its two American showings the exhibition will move on to Paris. It is sponsored here by the Institute of Arts Founders Society, the State of Michigan, the National Endowment for the Arts, and the Federal Council on the Arts and Humanities.
