50th Anniversary President

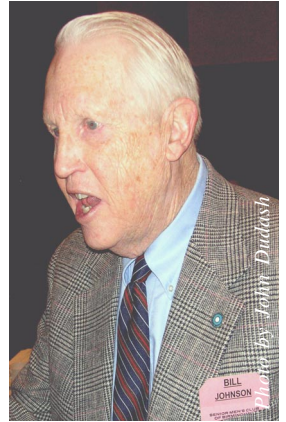

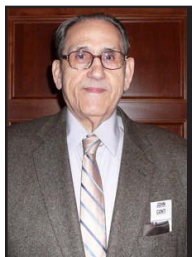

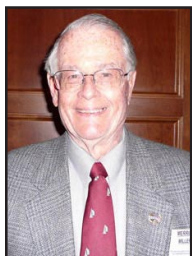

How I hate going out in the storm*

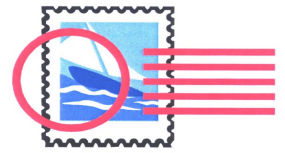
