Wednesday, May 5, at 10:30 AM: Apocalypse Never: Why Environmental Alarmism Hurts Us All by Michael Schellenberger. New York: Harper, 2020.

In reviewing this book, Steve McCormick, the former CEO of the Nature Conservancy writes, "We environmentalists condemn those with antithetical views of being ignorant of science and susceptible to confirmation bias. But too often we are guilty of the same. Shellenberger offers 'tough love:' a challenge to entrenched orthodoxies and rigid, self-defeating mindsets. Apocalypse Never serves up occasionally stinging, but always well-crafted, evidence-based points of view that will help develop the 'mental muscle' we need to envision and design not only a hopeful, but an attainable, future."

This book is sure to promote a lively discussion.

Monday, May 17, at 3:00 PM: The Anarchy: The East India Company, Corporate Violence and the Pillage of an Empire by William Dalrymple. London: Bloomsbury Publishing, 2019.

This important book was cited as a best book of the year by NPR and The Wall Street Journal. The Wall Street Journal reviewer wrote, "As William Dalrymple shows in his rampaging, brilliant, passionate history the East India Co. was the most advanced capitalist organization in the world . . . Mr. Dalrymple gives us every sword-slash, every scam, every groan and battle cry. He has no rival as a narrative historian of the British in India. "The Anarchy' is not simply a gripping tale of bloodshed and deceit, of unimaginable opulence and intolerable starvation. It is shot through with an unappeasable moral passion."

The Zoom address for the meeting will be shared through eblast the last week of the month.



This movie, based on the Pulitzer Prize winning novel of the same name, was produced and directed by Robert Rossen and stars Broderick Crawford, John Ireland, Mercedes McCambridge and Joanne Dru. The plot focuses on the rise and fall of the ambitious, ruthless and corrupt politician, Willie Stark (played by Broderick Crawford), and is generally regarded as having been based on the rise and fall of Huey Long, the infamous Louisiana Governor. The film won three Academy Awards: Best Picture, Best Actor (Broderick Crawford) and best Supporting Actress (Mercedes McCambridge) and was nominated for several other Academy Awards, including Best Director. The film was deemed culturally and historically significant by the Library of Congress and was selected for preservation in the United States National Film Registry.

So, mark your calendars now and join us on the 10th to enjoy one of best Political Noir/Drama films of the 20th Century. Be sure to bring your popcorn to make your movie going experience complete for you and your family.

This outstanding film, directed by Christian Bauer, tells the story of an elite WWll intelligence unit, known as the Ritchie Boys, that was stationed at Camp Ritchie, Maryland, and was tasked with devising ways to break the morale of German troops and to convince captured prisoners of war to fully divulge all their strategic military information. Many of the members of this unit had escaped from Nazi Germany and were deeply knowledgeable in how to best extract vital information from the prisoners. Our Dr Guy Stern is a Ritchie Boy and he will join Malcolm to participate in a discussion with us after the conclusion of the film.
