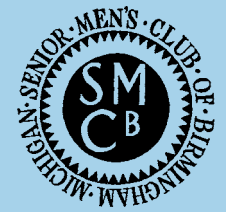

Military - Dick served in the U.S. Army Air Corps, including two years in the Pacific Theater including the battles of Iwo Jima and Okinawa

Business - Dick's business career included stints with major advertising and marketing companies including Campbell Ewald and BBDO. Among blue chip clients he served were Chrysler, FTD, Firestone, Boeing and Chevrolet.

Dick has been active in many capacities during his years of membership in the SMC. He notes that "everything about the club reflects quality - from the weekly programs to the friendliness of the members." At the same time, he sounds a cautionary note about membership. "Many of the men's clubs in this area are having difficulty meeting their numbers," noted Dick. "It's a very competitive market. We need to be ready to maintain our position of leadership."

Current format

On February 27, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) proposed to update the Nutrition Facts label for packaged foods. The FDA proposal would:

- Require information about the amount of added sugars in a food product.
- Update serving size to reflect the amount people currently eat.
- Require the declaration of potassium, beneficial in lowering blood pressure and vitamin D, important for its role in bone health. Vitamins A and C content would no longer be required but voluntary.
- Revise the Daily Values for sodium, dietary fiber and vitamin D. Daily Values are used to calculate the Percent Daily Value on the label which helps consumers understand the nutrition information in the context of a total daily diet.
- While continuing to require "Total Fat", "Saturated Fat", and "Trans Fat" on the label, "Calories from Fat" would be removed because the type of fat is more important than the amount.
- Refresh the format to emphasize calories, serving size and Percent Daily Value which are important in addressing problems like obesity and heart disease.

Certain meat, poultry and processed egg products are not affected by the changes, because they are regulated by the US Department of Agriculture food inspections.

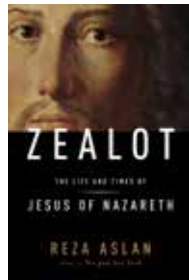


Book Reading Groups

On Wednesday, April 2 at 10:30AM we will discuss "Our Kind of Traitor" by John Le Carre. Those readers who have found post-cold war le Carré too cerebral will have much to cheer about with this Russian mafia spy thriller. While on holiday in Antigua, former Oxford tutor Perry Makepiece and his lawyer girlfriend, Gail Perkins, meet Dmitri "Dima" - a Russian businessman who challenges Perry to a tennis match. Even though Perry wins, Dima takes a shine to the couple, and soon they're visiting with his extended family. At Dima's request, Perry conveys a message to MI6 in England that Dima wishes to defect, and on arriving home, Dima is a one of the world's biggest money launderers. Le Carré ratchets up the tension step-by-step until the sad, inevitable end.



On Monday, April 21 at 3:00PM we will discuss "Zealot" by Reza Aslan. In Jesus' world, zealot referred to those Jews who adhered to a widely accepted biblical doctrine called zeal. These "jealous" Jews were strict nationalists who preached the sole sovereignty of God. Some zealots resorted to extreme acts of violence against both the Roman authorities and then priests and Jewish aristocracy. However, Jesus' actions and his teachings about the Kingdom of God clearly indicate that he was a follower of zealot doctrine, which is why he, like so many zealots before and after him, was ultimately executed by Rome for the crime of sedition.

Attendance Analysis



Attendance Chairman Dave Dinger recently completed an analysis of member attendance in 2013. One very notable and unfortunate finding is that 167 Club members did not attend

any Friday meetings last year. These results lead to two important questions:

1.) Who are these members in terms of their club status and residence? 2.) Why don't they attend any meetings? We can answer the first of these questions.

73 Life Members*
28 Live outside the immediate area*
55 "active" members
10 Deceased, dropped, resigned
17 Associate members
167 Total *16 Life Members live outside our area

A review of the names of the 73 Life Members provides a possible answer as to why they don't attend. Many of them are older men who once were very active, but now may find it difficult to get to the TCH. The possibility of reaching out to them and offering rides will be discussed with the Executive Board.

Reasons for non-attendance of other men on this list could include: lack of interest in Friday programs; other activities and interests; health; and other reasons.

Chairman Dinger is planning phone research as a first step to determine the "whys" of non-attendance. Most likely this research will start with a sample of the 55 "active" members and of the 17 Associate members who missed all 2013 meetings. Depending on initial research results, a more detailed questionnaire could follow to a much broader sample.
