FROM THE MINUTES OF JACK GORDON FOR
OUR MEETING OF MARCH 20th., IN 1964.

VISITATION:

The president spoke on the visit to Oakland County Medical Care Facility, by our members on March 15th and the satisfaction of giving some cheer to the inmates there. They were very appreciative of our efforts. He thanked the members who individually contributed to the program, mentioning Herb Flemington - John McCann - John Maloney and Clarence Johnson. We were also assisted by Mr. Killeen with guitar and songs - Mr. Fisher with Banjo and Mrs. Ellsworth at the piano. Mrs. Graupner and Mrs. Flemington pinned emerald green rosettes on all the patients assembled.

On May 2nd, 1958, it was suggested that meetings of this kind take place once a month. A group, headed by Charles Staples, called upon Tom Leonard, who was manager of the facility and learned that about 100 patients were cared for. Their ages would average about 75 years, and there was a very definite need for visitation and entertainment. We would be welcome between 2:00 and 3:00 O'clock afternoons.

This institution has been known by many names. Originally, it was called the Oakland County Infirmary - later, it was known as the Oakland County Hospital. It really is a combination Nursing Home and Hospital and is now known as the Oakland County Medical Care Facility.

Upon a motion, supported and passed unanimously, this activity was agreed upon. It was made the responsibility of our visiting committee. This function of our club has been pursued faithfully ever since. The first such visit was made later that same month.

Herbert Flemington presided over these visits with from 4 or 5 men often and occasionally as many as 25 or 30 men. Fred Graupner was another faithful header-upper, and there were others. We are still carrying on this activity - a most worthy cause. Take part in it.
