VIAL OF LIFE KIT OFFERED FREE AT FIRE STATIONS

At the October 17th meeting, Sgt. Ron Jacobson, Coordinator of the Emergency Medical Service for the Birmingham Fire Department, Adams Square Station, explained how the new Vial of Life program can protect individuals in time of emergency.

Made possible by the Birmingham Lions Club, the program includes a medical information sheet to be completed in advance and stored in a plastic vial in the refrigerator. The bottle is labeled VIAL OF LIFE and has space for the name of the participant. Labels are also provided for the refrigerator door and for the entrance door to the home. When summoned, EMS can go directly to the refrigerator for the vital medical information.

Sgt. Jacobson urged all members to visit their fire station in Birmingham or Bloomfield Township for a free Vial package for each member of the family.
