REPORT ON 1977 COMMUNITY HOUSE FUND DRIVE

Our Club's drive for operating funds for the Community House has ended. It is gratifying to witness the response to this good cause by the members of the Senior Men's Club, who make good use of the facilities, without cost, other than our donations.

Direct contributions by our Club have amounted to approximately \$7,800, with 98.5% of our members participating. The group headed by Murray Stewart in the telephone canvass received pledges of approximately \$13,800, of which \$7,500 has been received to date.
