





Wednesday, February 3 at 10:30 AM: Invisible Ink by Guy Stern. Detroit: Wayne State University Press.

At the young age of 98 Dr. Guy Stern published this remarkable autobiography telling the story of his childhood in Germany, continuing when his family sent him to live with relatives in St. Louis when he was 12 years old, serving in World War II, and building a distinguished academic and professional career. His life story is remarkable and inspirational; it is truly an American story.

One reviewer wrote, "Readers should be prepared to wrapped in and mesmerized by the eloquence and emotion of Guy Stern's words."

This discussion will be co-facilitated by Malcolm Hendy and Dr. Guy Stern himself!

Monday, February 15 at 3 PM: Caste: The Origins of our Discontent by Isabel Wilkerson. New York: Random House, 2020

SMCB reading group attendees may remember discussing Wilkerson's previous book, The Warmth of Other Sons about the migration of Blacks from the south to northern cities. In this current best-seller she describes a society-wide system of social stratification based on notion such as hierarchy, inclusion and exclusion, and purity. She does so by comparing this system with the caste systems of India and Nazi Germany. She then explores the impact of caste on societies and their people. The York Times reviewer called it "an instant classic".
