1986 COMMUNITY HOUSE ANNUAL FUND DRIVE- - A Message from Chick Holmes, Chairman, Special Projects

I realize that the 1985 Fund Drive is only two months behind us, and it may appear to be too soon to speak of another one. However, our new Director of Development, Mrs. William E. Hogle (Bev.), in consultation with experts and with the concurrence of the House Board of Directors, has recommended an early start and early finish. Our kickoff is scheduled for November 13, with a wrap-up by the end of March. She has enlisted a formidable Fund Drive Committee, chaired by Mr. and Mrs. Anthony M. Franco. Mr. Franco is the head of one of the largest public relations firms in the midwest.

We have set an ambitious and we think attainable goal of \$250,000 -- up from \$175,000. in 1985. This is divided: \$150,000 for operating funds and \$100,000 capital improvements. Our first solicitation letter is scheduled to be mailed just before Thanksgiving Day.

Now, another sign of progress! Harold Nyberg has agreed to accept the chairmanship of the Special Projects committee effective January 1. He has recruited Art Held and Milt Stuecheli as his lieutenants. I'm sure you will welcome them warmly and give them the same enthusiastic support that you have accorded me.
