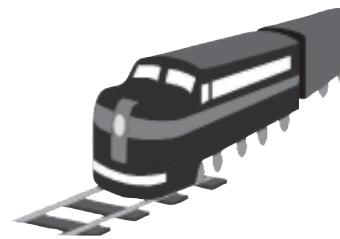
The weather should be great, the course is in excellent shape and your golfing companions await you. Are you coming?

## ---And "The Polar Express," Too!

The Special Events Committee wants you "rounders" and "gandy dancers" to reserve Tuesday, May 17, 2005 for a full day of railroading, when we revisit the ever-growing Steam Railroading Institute in Owosso, Michigan. It's fame has increased considerably since our last visit and in many ways:



- We will re-visit the fully restored and operational steam locomotive, No.1225, which is now world famous, since it was used as the prototype for the look and sounds of the tremendous hit movie, "The Polar Express," starring Tom Hanks. We will get the inside story of how it happened. This 2-8-4 Berkshire locomotive is one of 39 of the largest engines ever bought by the Pere Marquette Railroad back in 1941. More fame has been added because it is the cover story of the January 2005 edition of Trains magazine. Be sure to check your library.
- The Institute has recently completed a fully operating turn-table over 100 feet long. We will have a ride on this.
- They have built a new two-track engine house to make it an all-weather visit.
- The Institute now owns enough track to give us a shuttle ride using a fired-up little switcher steam engine with trailing cabooses.
- We will have a boxed lunch that will be served in the meeting hall of the new visitor center-which includes an added museum and gift shop area. The lunch will have a choice of three entrees: grilled chicken sandwich, club sandwich, or tuna melt.

Tickets are bargain priced at \$30 each. The bus will leave the First Presbyterian Church parking lot at 8:30 a.m. and return about 4:30 p.m. Tickets will go on sale beginning Friday, April 29, 2005.

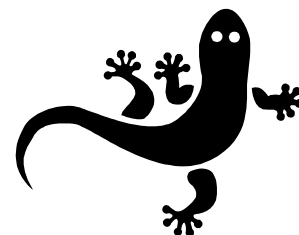

# MEMBERSHIP CHANGES

With Executive Board and membership approval, the Senior Men's Club recently eliminated our previous geographic membership boundaries. Our club is now open to men who satisfy the eligibility criteria in our revised Constitution, regardless of their residence location.

The Board has anticipated that we should expect to experience a gradual expansion in the applicant count, which will serve to reverse the decline in this category of recent years.

Early indications are that this expected change is developing - the March *Reminder* listed ten new applicants who reside outside our previous boundaries. More recently, the Membership Committee reported to the Board that an additional dozen applications have been received from areas like West Bloomfield, Farmington Hills, etc.

While it is of course difficult to judge how many new applicants we should expect, an examination of the Senior Women's Club roster provides some clues. The SWC, which has no geographic restriction for membership, has about 169 members who live outside our previous boundaries. It should be noted that this total has built up over the ten plus years the Women's club has existed.

These ladies live in wide range of towns and communities, but only 25 live outside Oakland County. They have 22 members from Royal Oak, 19 from Southfield, 18 from West Bloomfield, and 17 from Farmington Hills.

Our Applicant, Membership and Attendance Committees have the ongoing responsibility of monitoring the impact of these changes on our member count and on meeting attendance, and to recommend any attendance restrictions or limitation on our applicant count which might become appropriate longer range

## Financial Data

Friday Lunch price increased to \$2 (members eating less than a "full" lunch were asked to pay a "reasonable" amount)

Interest earned on the club checking account was 5 1/4 % with 11 1/2% earned on a money market certificate. The Christmas Party fee was \$8.25.

Members contributed slightly over \$10,000 to the annual Community House Fund Drive, with a striking 98% participating (if a member didn't contribute, he received a personal phone call).

The annual collection for the Children's Village totalled \$300.

## Membership Data

Average Friday meeting attendance was 170, with the peak at 229.

The mid year membership count was 400, plus 24 life members.

The applicant count was 164, with a two and a half year wait before reaching active membership.

## In the category of "some things never change"

Microphone (sound problems were a common complaint).

Sandwich quality issues were noted-dry bread, poor tuna.

Sandwich count problems were identified, members were reminded to "take only one sandwich."

President Phil Satterthwaite and Sergeant at Arms member Jules Falke advised members to maintain quiet during presentations and to remain seated until meetings concluded.

Planning to celebrate the 25th Club anniversary in 1982 began.
