# **Special Events**

#### Ford's Piquette Assembly Plant

On April 26 we will visit this world-famous Automotive Heritage site, built in 1904 at Milwaukee Junction, at that time the bustling industrial heart of Automobile manufacturing in Detroit.

Model-N production had started at Piquette, Henry's first purpose-built 3-story light-filled factory. Using the Model-N as a platform, Model-T development began in January 1907, and only 8 months later in late September, the first Model-T left the factory.

With each car team-built, demand fast outgrew Piquette's capacity, resulting in a move in 1910 to the much larger Highland Park Plant and the first real application of the assembly line. By the time Model-T production ceased in 1927, 15 million had been sold!

During the visit we will learn the history of this remarkable building, covering just 400 x 56 feet. Volunteer staff will answer questions, such as parts supply and how cars were shipped. The tour is "senior-friendly" with an elevator and many photos and memorabilia on display.

The bus will take us to a convivial lunch at the popular Traffic Jam & Snug on West Canfield in Detroit and we should be back in Birmingham mid-afternoon.

The bus will depart from First Presbyterian Church as usual. Cost is \$45 and tickets go on sale on March 10.

#### Hold the Date...June 11 USPBL Baseball!


