- Oversee post retreat activities.

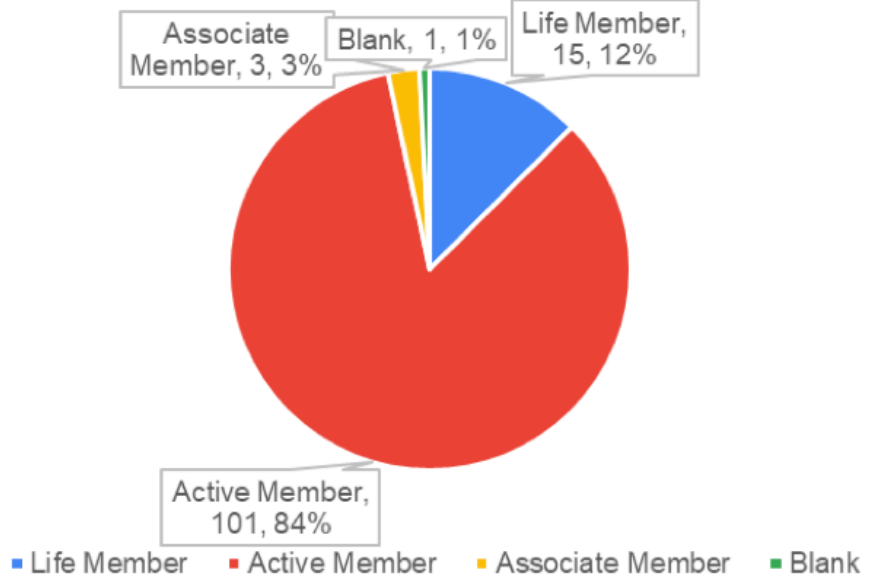

Perry has been a member of SMC for over ten years. He was born 85 years ago on October 25, 1936 in New York City. He graduated from New Trier High School in Winnetka, Illinois. This was followed by Bachelor of Arts degree from Harvard College, Cambridge, Massachusetts. His

Postgraduate education was at Northwestern University, where he received the degree of Master of Science, and subsequently secured a Master's in Business Administration degree from Harvard Business School.

He served in the U.S. Army at Fort Dix, New Jersey, and the Army Reserves for 6 years from 1961 to 1967.

Professionally, he was a Banker as the Senior VP & President of Michigan National Bank, VP & Treasurer of Michigan National Corporation and Chairman of Michigan Heritage Bank. He was Adjunct Professor of Business & Finance at Walsh College and Southern Virginia University; Director & VP – Harvard Business School Alumni Board, Boston; Director & Chair of Finance Committee – Michigan State University Foundation and Director of Eton Academy in Birmingham, Michigan.

He has been active in community and educational groups in Michigan communities wherever he has lived, and he was President of the Lansing Symphony Association Board and General Campaign Chair for the Capital Area United Way Fund in Lansing.

He is married to Lorraine since 1988. Perry has 6 children and 11 grandchildren and belongs to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.

He moved from Michigan to St. George, Utah six months ago.

In SMC, he was a Program Committee chair and contributed to the Moment of Interest.



### JOHN FLINTOSH

John was the SMC President in 2011. He was born in Detroit where he attended Mackenzie High School. He graduated from the University of Michigan with a Bachelor in International economics and got his MBA from Michigan State University in Advanced Management program.

Between 1960 and 62, he served as Director in the U.S. Army Air Defense Artillery, San Francisco Air Defense Sector. He was responsible for tactical coordination of air defense missile units in northern California.

John joined Ford Motor company in 1962 and had assignments in finance, sales, marketing and customer service, including customer affairs manager. Prior to retirement in 1999, after 37 years with Ford Motor Division, he was the regulatory compliance manager in Dearborn.

He was a member of Chi Phi fraternity at U of M, President of AMP club of MSU, recipient of Beta Sigma Gamma Scholastic Honorary MBA and President National Coalition for Consumer Education from 1990 to 96.

He was the chairman of the Society of Consumer Affairs Professionals in Business International and was granted the Esther Shapiro Award for Leadership in Consumer Affairs in 1998. He also served as a director of the Better Business Bureau of Detroit and southeastern Michigan.

John received the SMC President's award in 2012 and the SMC Outstanding Service award in 2017. He served as chairman of the Associates committee and as a member of special events, legacy endowment, policy, procedure manual, investment group and 60th anniversary committees. He was the Associate editor and proof reader for the Reminder and weekly Friday meeting minutes.

He is single and an avid golfer and a member of the St. Owen Catholic Church in Bloomfield Hills.

He was born in 1936 on small family farm in Central Pennsylvania in the town of Utahville. This farm was founded 1882 and is still family-owned. They got electricity when he was 13 and running water at the age of 19.

George received a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering from Penn State University in 1958. This was followed by Master Automobile Engineer certificate from Chrysler Institute in 1960 and a MBA in Finance from University of Detroit in 1965.

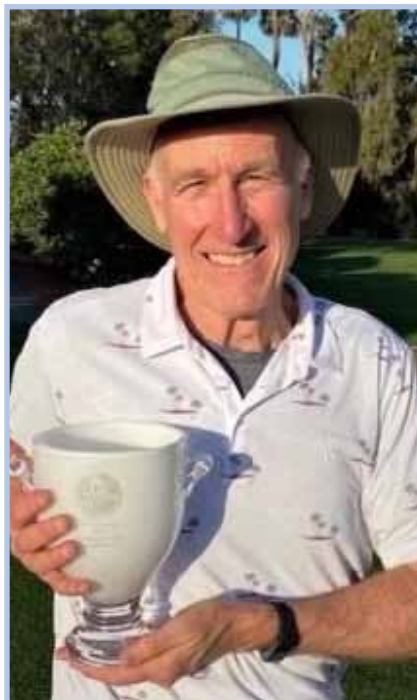
He worked at Chrysler Corp from 1957 to 1991 as Executive Engineer in Engineering and Product Planning. He was the Finance Planner on Dodge Charger, Plymouth Barracuda, Chrysler Cordoba, Chrysler Turbine and others. He spent 10 years with Chrysler Mexico in developing product S strategy.

He likes outdoors and has bagged over 70 deer, and loves snowmobiling.

In February we will discuss two very different books that, each in their own way, deals with race in America. The first is Colson Whitehead's engaging novel featuring a zany bunch of characters in Harlem in the early 1960's. The second is Charles Murray's latest look at racial distinctions related to IQ, crime rates and other social issues.

Roger Timm has finalized the schedule of Wednesday discussions beginning this month and continuing through early next year.

We will continue to meet via Zoom for February and March. At the March meetings we will consider returning to in-person meetings for future months.

**B) Wednesday, February 2 at 10:30 AM: *Harlem Shuffle*** by Colson Whitehead (New York: Doubleday, 2021)

As the author of two books we've previously discussed, *Underground Railroad* and *Nickle Boys*, Whitehead moves this time to Harlem in the early 1960's. It is the story of Ray Carney, furniture salesman and small-time crook, as he attempts to navigate his local environment, New York City and America during the Kennedy administration.

The Associated Press reviewer wrote, "Harlem Shuffle" is a wildly entertaining romp. But as you might expect with this two-time Pulitzer Prize winner and MacArthur genius, Whitehead also delivers a devastating, historically-grounded indictment of the separate and unequal lives of Blacks and Whites in mid-20th century New York."

This discussion will be led by Bob Maxfield.

**A) Monday, February 21 at 3:00 PM: *Facing Reality: Two Truths about Race in America*** by Charles Murray. (Encounter Books, 2021)

Charles Murray begins with the assumption that Black Americans tend to have lower IQ's and also tend to be more criminally violent than other races or ethnicities. He believes that bringing these "realities" into the open allows us to discuss the importance of the American Creed — people are, and should be, judged on an equal basis regardless of factors such as race, national origin or social class. He believes judging on an equal basis conflicts with much current public policy regarding the role of the state in confronting racism.

This discussion will be led by Jim Zyla.

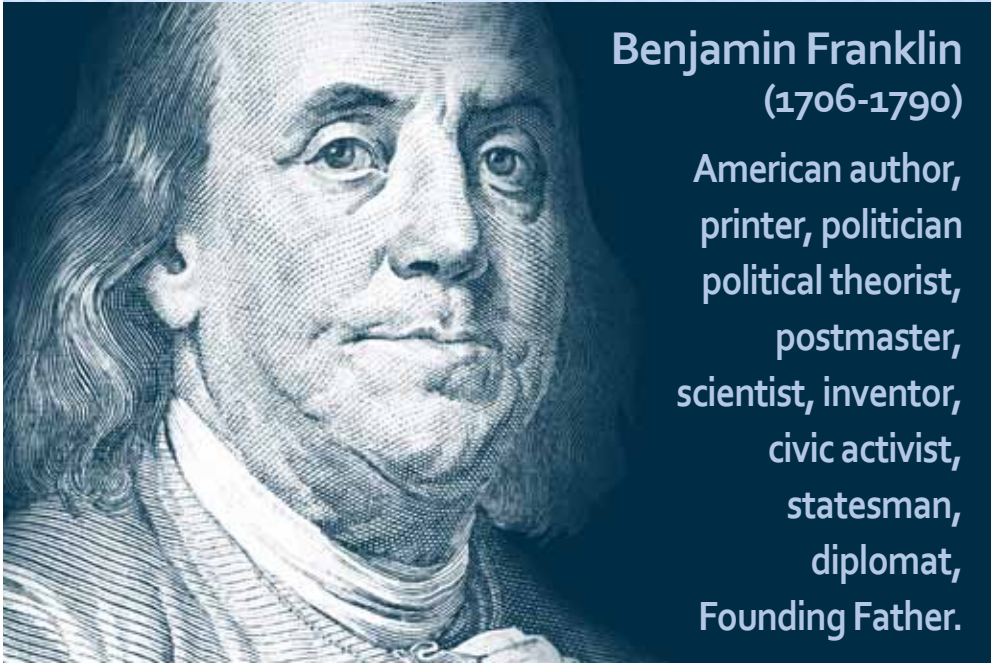
