CAMERA GROUP FIELD TRIP

Date: 2:00 P.M.; Tuesday, June 14, 1977; or in case of rain June 14, Wednesday, June 15, 1977.

Location: Grounds of Cranbrook Educational Cultural Center on Lone Pine Road, west of Cranbrook Road.

Directions: Drive into the grounds via Academy Way and turn right at statue of Jonah and the Whale. Turn right again at the first driveway and then left down the hill into Parking Lot A. There you will be given a map of the grounds and a badge identifying you as a member of the Senior Men's Club party.

There will be a guard house either at the entrance of Academy Way or further into the grounds. Stop there and identify yourself as a member of the Senior Men's Club party. A member of the Camera Group will be stationed there, if possible.

If you want to take the opportunity to visit either of the museums, admission for senior citizens is 75 cents at the Academy of Art Museum and \$1.25 at the Cranbrook Institute of Science.

It is suggested that you will want to take advantage of the various parking lots, since the spacing of the photographic targets might call for too much walking. To reach Parking Lot C, return to Lone Pine Road and drive west, turning right into driveway just before Orchard Ridge Road.
