Prof. Jay Rowell

"Has the war in Ukraine changed Europe?

What does that mean for the transatlantic relationship?"

A specialist of the European Union, Jay Rowell will discuss the resilience of the EU despite major challenges, and its implications for the transatlantic relationship and the overall balance of power in the world.

Many observers foresaw that slow economic growth, challenges of migration, terrorist attacks, Brexit, the America First agenda, the Covid crisis, and the war in the Ukraine would be too much for the EU to withstand. But he notes that despite this succession of crises, the EU has proved to be remarkably resilient.

Dr. Rowell's research interests include European integration, comparative social policy in Europe, and the politics of higher education. His teaching has included sociology of European integration, American politics, and sociology of public opinion.

A graduate of Groves High School in Birmingham, Jay Rowell studied political science and history at Duke University. He earned graduate degrees and a Ph.D. at the Institute for Political Studies and the School for Social Sciences in Paris.
