SMCB GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

In 2022, the Rules Committee (now the Governance Committee) drafted revisions to the Club's Bylaws and Constitution reflecting our departure from The Community House and the reorganization of the Board of Directors (the Club's leadership team). Those revisions were approved by the Board and by the membership.

In 2023, the focus is on updating the club's Procedure Manual. The Procedure Manual has two parts; first several policies approved by the Board of Directors, followed by committee procedures documented by the committees themselves. The Governance Committee drafted changes to the policies reflecting the above revisions, which were approved at the April Board of Directors Meeting. In addition, the Officers and Standing Committee chairs agreed to take on the task of rewriting procedures for all standing committees, subcommittees and groups. These are to be completed in time for submission to the Board of Directors June 13 meeting, with the Procedure Manual expected to be published by June 30, 2023 and posted on the club's website shortly thereafter.

In a surprise move at the April 14, 2023 Friday meeting, 1st Vice President Larry Imerman introduced a segment of "SMCB Show and Tell" featuring Active Member Dr. John Paesano and Life Member Kirby Callam.

As many of us know, John is a long-time model aircraft builder. Demonstrating the Club core values of Fellowship and Friendship and inspired by our friend Kirby Callam and tales of Kirby's time as a Navy aviator during the Korean War era, Paesano built a replica of the Grumman F9-2 Panther, Kirby's aircraft, which he presented to Kirby. In his typically reserved fashion Kirby would not talk of his aerial exploits, saying only that his leg length precluded him from ever bailing out of the aircraft so he had to land it, no matter what. He finally told this writer he divided four years of service stateside at Pensacola and at Jacksonville, first as a pilot, later as a flight instructor. His proficiency ratings allowed him to ignore control tower instructions, relying on his own skills under otherwise safe conditions. The Grumann F9 was a workhorse in Korea and was the first jet aircraft employed by the Navy's "Blue Angels" precision flight squad.

A hearty SMCB 'attaboy" to both John and Kirby for this fine display of mutual respect and service to others, qualities that make SMCB members unique. Commend John for his thoughtful tribute, and give Kirby a snappy salute when next you see them.

On Monday, May 8th at 1:00 PM, via Zoom, the Classic Movie Group will be showing the 1990 award winning film GOODFELLAS (2 hours / 26 minutes) directed by Martin Scorsese and starring Robert De Niro, Ray Liotta, Joe Pesci, Lorraine Bracco and Paul Sorvino. Goodfellas is based on the lives of the notorious gangsters: Henry Hill, played by Liotta, James Conway, played by De Niro, and Tommy DeVito, played by Pesci, and on one of the most daring robberies in American history.

Many film critics consider Goodfellas the ultimate, definitive, and very best mob movie. The film is not for the prudish or the faint of heart: at the time of its release, it set the record for the most profanity of any movie in history and it contains numerous depictions of extreme violence and bloodletting.

The film was nominated for seven Academy Awards, including Best Picture, Best Director, Best Supporting Actor and Best Supporting Actress, and Joe Pesci won the Academy Award for Best Supporting Actor. The film won the Golden Globe Awards for Best Picture and Best Director. Unless you are prudish and faint of heart (which is unlikely since you are a member of the SMCB, a group of Alpha males!), you will not want to miss this masterpiece.

The two books being discussed in May focus on two very different women, each of whom played an important role in 20th century history. The first is historical fiction that provides insight into the early labor movement and the history of Michigan's Upper Peninsula. (This discussion has been rescheduled from last October.) The second is a memoir written by a little-known female aviation pioneer Her book was described by Earnest Hemingway as follows: "Written so well, and marvelously well, that I was completely ashamed of myself as a writer. [Markham] can write rings around all of us who consider ourselves as writers...it really is a bloody wonderful book."

Wednesday, May 3, 10:30 AM: The Women of Copper Country by Mary Doria Russell. (New York: Atria Books, 2019)

This is an engrossing historical novel that tells the story of the 1913 copper miners' strike in Calumet Michigan. It is told from the perspective of Annie Clements, the 25-year-old woman who organized the forces that led to a strike involving thousands of workers. She became known as America's Joan of Arc. It provides important insights into the evolution of the labor movement in the early 20th century.

The Kirkus Review described the book as "historical fiction that feels uncomfortably relevant today".

Monday, May 15, 3 PM: West with the Night by Beryl Markham. New York: North Point Press, Second Edition, 2013)

This book was first published in 1942 and received little interest. However, when it was republished in 1983, it became a best-seller and is now regarded as a classic of aviation history.

From Amazon's description: "Beryl Markham (1902-1986) was a racehorse trainer and breeder, aviator, and author.

She grew up on her father's horse ranch in Kenya, learning Swahili, Nandi, and Masai, and spear hunting with the local Nandi Murani tribe. In 1933 she became the first woman in Kenya to become a commercial pilot. In 1936 Markham, who was already a well-known figure among in aviation circles, made international news when she became the first woman to make a non-stop solo transatlantic flight from Europe to North America. After a stint in Hollywood, Markham returned to Kenya and trained horses until her death in 1983."


