### JANUARY SPECIAL EVENT OPPORTUNITY

Begin 2024 with a trip to a familiar nearby location with new things to see. Join the Senior Men's Club of Birmingham for an outing at The Henry Ford Museum of American Innovation in Dearborn on Wednesday, January 10. If you have not been to the Ford Museum for a while, you may have not yet experienced recently-added permanent exhibits, such as the comprehensive and interactive Driven to Win motorsports display. Even if you have been to the Ford Museum this season, you have probably not yet seen the stunning and moving special exhibit which just opened on the life of South African patriot, political leader and human rights legend Nelson Mandela, Mandela: The Official Exhibition.

Mandela: The Official Exhibition is an immersive and interactive experience featuring previously-unseen film, photos and a display of over 150 historical artifacts and personal effects on loan from the Mandela family, museums and archives worldwide. (These are real pieces, not replicas or representations.) Through a series of immersive zones — each one a dramatically different experience — we will be taken on a journey through Mandela's remarkable life. His epic story is told in a series of experiential galleries, from his rural childhood home through the years of struggle against apartheid to his eventual vindication and final years as South Africa's first democratically-elected president.

The Mandela exhibit will be at The Henry Ford only through January 15, 2024, so this is the time to see it.

Another recently-added display at the museum is Lillian Schwartz: Whirlwind of Creativity. The Henry Ford Museum acquired the art, objects and papers of this pioneering digital artist and has fashioned an exhibit of this breakthrough material. Lillian Schwartz was creating digital art when computers were largely mainframes and phones were tabletop devices with cords and dial tones.

All of the other great Ford Museum attractions remain, including the Giant Screen Experience theatre with dramatic documentary short films. Lunch will be on your own at any one of several dining venues at The Henry Ford.

# MONDAY AND WEDNESDAY READING GROUPS DECEMBER 2023

In December we will discuss two books which are sure to provoke serious discussions. The first explores a little-know plot to kill the allied leaders in World War II. The second is a biography of Elie Wiesel, which is particularly timely given the current concerns about antisemitism.

As we approach the new year, you are encouraged to check the club's website for the schedule of books to be discussed during 2024. Both groups will continue to meet via Zoom. Please let Roger Timm or Bob Maxfield know if you wish to be added to our distribution list.

Wednesday, December 6, 10:30 AM: The Nazi Conspiracy: The Secret Plot to Kill Roosevelt, Stalin, and Churchill by Brad Meltzer and Josh Mensch. (New York: Flatiron Books, 2023) This discussion will be led by Bill Price.

From the publisher: "In 1943, as the war against Nazi Germany raged abroad, President Franklin Roosevelt had a critical goal: a face-to-face sit-down with his allies Joseph Stalin and Winston Churchill. This first-ever meeting of the Big Three in Tehran, Iran, would decide some of the most crucial strategic details of the war. Yet when the Nazis found out about the meeting, their own secret plan took shape—an assassination plot that would have changed history. A true story filled with daring rescues, body doubles, and political intrigue, The Nazi Conspiracy details FDR's pivotal meeting in Tehran and the deadly Nazi plot against the heads of state of the three major Allied powers who attended it. From the New York Review of Books: "Meltzer and Mensch…give history a sheen of drama that it deserves while leaving the reader with much to consider."

Monday, December 18, 3 PM: Elie Wiesel: Confronting the Silence by Joseph Berger. (New Haven: Yale University Press, 2023). Bob Frank will lead this discussion.

From Amazon: "As an orphaned survivor and witness to the horrors of Auschwitz, Elie Wiesel (1928–2016) compelled the world to confront the Holocaust with his searing memoir Night. How did this soft-spoken man from a small Carpathian town become such an influential figure on the world stage? Drawing on Wiesel's prodigious literary output and interviews with his family, friends, scholars, and critics, Joseph Berger seeks to answer this question." The reviewer in The Jewish Voice praised this book as "beautifully written, even-handed, and illuminating account of an unassuming, but haunted man from a small shtetl who warned the 'the opposite of love is not hate, it is indifference'."


