I am pleased to introduce our newest Life Member, Mike Frank. Mike was born in 1938 on the island of Mindanao, Philippines where his family owned the local electric utility company. Mike, his mother, and his siblings fled the country in April 1941, as the threat of a Japanese invasion grew. His father remained. Mike would not learn of his father's fate until the American Army liberated the Japanese camp where his father was held prisoner.

Mike graduated from John Carroll University in Cleveland. At the university, he was a long-distance runner and an editor of the college newspaper, the Carroll News. He served in the Army Reserves. He came to Michigan to teach Latin and English at Troy High School. Mike taught in Troy for 44 years.

At Troy High, Mike created a class called Film and Literature, which he also taught at Oakland Community College. He received a Masters degree in English Literature from the University of Michigan in 1969.

Mike took a leave of absence from the Troy Schools in 1970 to teach in Okinawa. There he taught children of military personnel during the day and college classes for the University of Maryland at night.


Mike has been married to Judy for 50 years. Their daughter, Erin, lives in Milwaukee.




























# Golf Report - Reminder November 2023
