## CLASSIC MOVIE GROUP



On Monday, May 13th, at 1:00 PM, via Zoom, the Classic Movie Group will be showing the 2012 award winning historical drama thriller "ARGO".

The film (with a run time of 2 hours) was directed by and stars Ben Affleck as C.I.A. operative Tony Mendez, with strong supporting roles by Bryan Cranston, Alan Arkin and John Goodman. The film

was adapted, in part, from Mendez's memoir "The Master of Disguise". The film received seven Academy Award nominations and won three, for Best Picture, Best Adapted Screenplay and Best Film Editing.

The setting is the 1979-1981 Iran Hostage Crisis. Ayatollah Khomeini had recently returned to the country from exile and on November 4, 1979, Iranian extremists stormed the U.S. Embassy in Tehran; sixty- six of the embassy staff were taken as hostages and remained hostages for 444 days, but six avoided capture and were sheltered in the home of

Canadian Ambassador Ken Taylor. ARGO is the story of how Mendez and the C.I.A. engineered, and Mendez successfully carried out, a daring, improbable and high risk plan to extricate and send home the six American Embassy escapees. The film, in addition to being a financial success, won near unanimous critical acclaim, with reviews such as the one from influential Chicago Sun-Times critic Roger Ebert, who gave the film four out of four stars, calling it "spellbinding" and chose it as the best film of the year. This is a film you will definitely not want to miss. Even though you know the outcome, the film will keep you mesmerized, on the edge of your seat and praying that the outlandish ruse concocted by Mendez and the C.I.A. works and that the six Americans will somehow manage to escape from Iran. A preview of the film is now available on the Club's website.

So, mark your calendars now and plan to join our Group, on May 13, to watch and enjoy this fascinating thriller/action film. Please note that the Zoom link for the movie will be at the top of the Scheduled Events eBlast for the week of May 12, which will be published on Friday morning May 10.

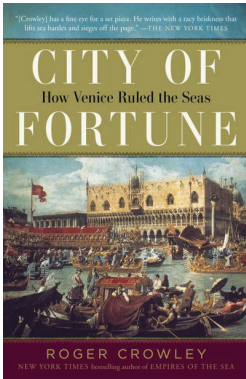

**Wednesday, May 1, 10:30 AM:** *City of Fortune: How Venice Ruled the Seas* by Roger Crowley (New York, Random House, 2013) Paul Lieberman will lead the discussion.

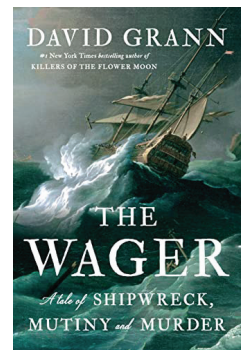
The rise and fall of Venice's empire is an irresistible story. *City of Fortune* charts Venice's astounding five-hundred-year voyage to the pinnacle of power in an epic story that stands unrivaled for drama, intrigue, and sheer opulent majesty. It traces the full arc of the Venetian imperial saga, from the ill-fated Fourth Crusade, which culminates in the sacking of Constantinople in 1204, to the Ottoman-Venetian War of 1499–1503, which sees the Ottoman Turks supplant the Venetians as the preeminent naval power in the Mediterranean. In between are three centuries of Venetian maritime dominance, during which a tiny city of "lagoon dwellers" grows into the richest place on earth. Crowley paints a vivid picture of this avaricious, enterprising people and the bountiful lands that came under their dominion. From the opening of the spice routes to the clash between Christianity and Islam, Venice played a leading role in the defining conflicts of its time—the reverberations of which are still being felt today.

From the Wall Street Journal review: "Crowley chronicles the peak of Venice's past glory with Wordsworthian sympathy, supplemented by impressive learning and infectious enthusiasm."

**Monday, May 20, 4 PM:** *The Wager: A Tale of Shipwreck, Mutiny and Murder* by David Grann. (New York: Doubleday, 2023) Recommended by Bob Maxfield, discussion will be led by Bill Price.

From the author of *Killers of the Flower Moon*, a page-turning story of shipwreck, survival, and savagery, culminating in a court martial that reveals a shocking truth. The powerful narrative reveals the deeper meaning of the events on *The Wager*, showing that it was not only the captain and crew who ended up on trial, but the very idea of empire. This was named as A Best Book of the Year by The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, The New Yorker, TIME, Smithsonian, NPR, Vulture, and Kirkus Reviews.

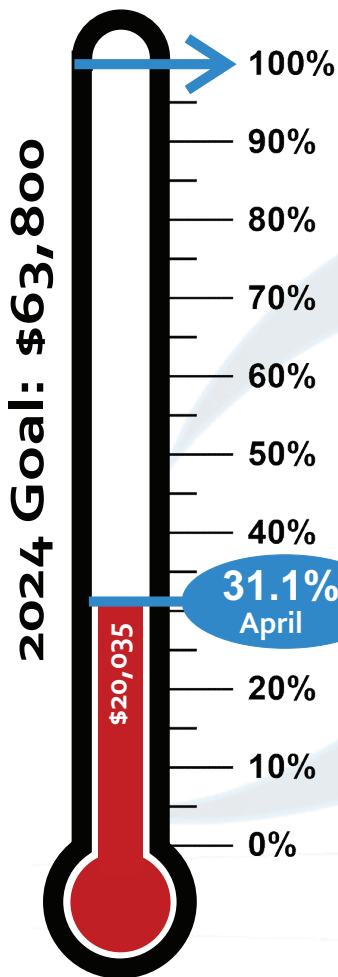
**Habitat For Humanity**

On March 22, 2024, a check (\$10,000) was presented to Hospice of Michigan by Jim Fleck of SMC Foundation and John Maten, President, SMCB to Habitat of Michigan. The funding will be directed towards the Habitat 'Critical Home Repair' program in the Tri-county area. Two Seniors will benefit. The first is gutter repair, driveway, and back patio repair/replacement to improve water intrusion and trip hazards. The second will conduct gutter and driveway replacement to repair trip hazards. Trips and falls are a significant hazard to seniors. Both Senior Men had appealed to Habitat For Humanity and the Senior Men's Club Foundation because they were unable for financial reasons to have the repairs made.

**Foundation Awards Two Grants**

**Hospice of Michigan**

On March 22, The Senior Men's Club Foundation presented a check to Hospice of Michigan \$10,000 by Jim Fleck of SMC Foundation and John Maten, President of the Senior Men's Club of Birmingham to Hospice of Michigan. Hospice works with 5,000 patients, 4,500 care givers and 14,000 family members each year. Each Senior Men's Club of Birmingham member has been touched in their lives by the benefits of Hospice care. Hospice of Michigan is well-established in the Tri-county area. This grant specifically addresses Veterans who represent 35% of all Seniors with a pinning ceremony. Hospice representatives will go to recipients in many cases at their bedside and nearing end of life to say "thank you" to those who have served their country with a special ceremony.
