## LIFE MEMBER INDUCTION -Dave Bakos



I am very pleased to recognize Dave Bakos as our latest life member. Dave joined the Senior Men's Club in 2013 and was motioned into the club by Rick Ganfield. He was born in Cambridge, Ohio in 1935, the youngest of eight children. His parents had emigrated from Slovakia.

He attended GMI and graduated as an Industrial Engineer. Dave started in manufacturing at the Chevrolet Cleveland Stamping Plant, transferred to the Chevrolet Warren Axle Plant as General Superintendent of Manufacturing, later to a position with Chevrolet Planning, then to Chevrolet Livonia Spring and Bumper. His last assignment was with the North America Engineering Group as Director of General Assembly. He retired after 47 years with GM.

Upon retirement, he took up glass blowing as a hobby and spent 10 years with a group of artists at Michigan Hot Glass located at the Russell Industrial Center in Detroit. He also was an Engineering Mentor for the University of Michigan Multidisciplinary Design Program for four years. He chaired SMCB Genealogy Group for 7 years and sat on several of our Club's ad hoc committees. Dave has been married to his wife Judy for 22 years and lives in Bloomfield Township. Dave has three children: David and his wife Juliane; Renee; and Bethany and her husband John. Bethany and John have two daughters: Sedona who is a junior in high school; and Quincy who is a sophomore at Oregon State.

# CLASSIC MOVIE GROUP

The Classic Movie presentation for March 2023 is Cool Hand Luke, starting Paul Newman and featuring George Kennedy in an Oscar-winning performance. Other cast members include Dennis Hopper, Wayne Rogers, J.D. Cannon, Joe Don Baker, Jo Van Fleet and Joy Harmon. Set in the early 1950s, it is based on Donn Pearce's 1965 novel of the same name.

Newman stars in the title role as Luke, a prisoner in a Florida prison camp who refuses to submit to the system. When petty criminal Luke Jackson (Paul Newman) is sentenced to two years in a Florida prison farm, he doesn't play by the rules of either the sadistic warden (Strother Martin) or the yard's resident heavy, Dragline (George Kennedy), who ends up admiring the new guy's unbreakable will. Luke's bravado, even in the face of repeated stints in the prison's dreaded solitary confinement cell, "the box," make him a rebel hero to his fellow convicts and a thorn in the side of the prison officers.

The movie has several quotable lines but the most famous and enduring is – "What we've got here is... failure to communicate." To see this statement delivered in the context of this movie is memorable theater. It is one of those movie lines you never forget. This quote is listed at number 11 on the American Film Institute's 100Years...100 Movie Quotes list.

Cool Hand Luke was released in 1967 and was considered a box-office success. In 2005, the United States Library of Congress selected the film for preservation in the National Film Registry, considering it "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant" The film has a 100% rating on the review aggregator website Rotten Tomatoes.

This movie runs about 2 hours. Our DVD is a modern Digital Transfer from Restored Picture and Audio Elements providing excellent video and audio.

History and adventure buffs will enjoy discussing the two March books. The first is an excellent work of historical fiction set in the Mexican War in the late 1840s. It introduces characters who later played major roles in the Civil War. The second is the harrowing true story of the Whaleship Essex in 1820.

Wednesday, March 1 at 10:30 AM: Gone for Soldiers: A Novel of the Mexican War by Jeff Shaara. (New York: Ballantine Books, 2000)

From the Library Journal: "This is Shaara's successful prequel to his father Michael's Pulitzer Prize-winning Civil War novel, The Killer Angels. Many of the same characters inhabit its pages but before their allegiances have been fatally strained by the tensions of an impending Civil War. The protagonists are Gen. Winfield Scott, who created our first modern army, and young engineer Robert E. Lee, being tested for the first time as soldier and leader in the little-known Mexican War. Add Stonewall Jackson, Ulysses S. Grant, Jeb Stuart, Joe Johnston, Beauregard, Mexican general Santa Anna. What a cast of characters! "

One reviewer called this book "Another fine historical novel from a new master of the genre."

Roger Timm will lead this discussion.

Monday, March 20 at 3 PM:In the Heart of the Sea: The Tragedy of the Whaleship Essex by Nathaniel Philbrick. (New York: Penguin Books, 2001)

This is the true story of the whaleship Essex and its crew on an ill-fated voyage to the Pacific Ocean in 1820. After the ship was attacked and destroyed by a sperm whale, the crew attempted to reach South America on the ship's small boats. The story is said to have inspired Melville to write Moby Dick. Ron Howard told the story in his 2015 film.

From the NY Times review: "Philbrick has created an eerie



thriller from a centuries-old tale of cannibalism on the high seas. It's all here: audacious seamanship, untold suffering, race and madness. And it's true. Scrupulously researched and elegantly written, In the Heart of the Sea is a masterpiece of maritime history. It would have earned Melville's admiration."

This book was nominated by Roger Timm, and the discussion will be led by Bob Stevenson.

Even though the City of Birmingham has raised rates by 50 cents this year, we will hold the price of \$15.00 for all walk-ons at both courses.
